Trip Itinerary

Day 1: Wednesday, April 3, 2024

Morning departure from Wallace State. Lunch on your own enroute. Check into the Hotel Roanoke and Conference Center, Curio Collection by Hilton in Roanoke, VA. Dinner included at hotel this evening. (Meals: D)

Day 2: Thursday, April 4, 2024

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel and depart for Washington, DC. This afternoon we will have four hours to visit your choice of the Smithsonian Institution's Museums on the National Mall. You will need to specify your choice of museum including: National Museum of African American History and Culture, National Museum of American History, National Air and Space Museum, National Museum of Natural History, National Museum of the America Indian, National Gallery of Art, Freer and Sackler Gallery, Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden, or the National Museum of African Art. Lunch is on your own at one of the museums or along the National Mall. This evening, dinner will be at Carmine's. The menu consists of Carmine's Salad, Stuffed Mushrooms, Lasagna, Spaghetti and Meatballs, Chicken Marsala and Mushrooms, Salmon Oreganata, Classic Tiramisu, and unlimited soda and iced tea. After dinner, we check into the McLean Hilton, our home for the next four nights. (Meals: B, D)

Day 3: Friday, April 5, 2024

After breakfast at the hotel, we visit Arlington National Cemetery. As we travel on the tram, we will stop at the Kennedy Gravesite and the Tomb of the Unknown Solider and hopefully see the Changing of the Guard. Next on the agenda are stops at memorials and monuments including: Marine Corps Memorial (Iwo Jima Statue), National World War II Memorial, Lincoln Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, Korean War Memorial. We then revisit the National Mall for a two-hour time period. You may choose another museum to visit, enjoy a leisurely stroll along the National Mall, or lunch (on your own) during this time. Later in the afternoon, if the cherry blossoms cooperate, there will be a Pink Tour of the Tidal Basin with visits to the Jefferson Memorial, Franklin D. Roosevelt Memorial, and the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial. Dinner this evening will be at Tony and Joe's Seafood Place at Washington Harbour, an upscale restaurant in Georgetown. (Meals: B, D)

Day 4: Saturday, April 6, 2024

After breakfast at the hotel, there will be a stop for a photo opportunity at the White House. Then it is on to the National World War I Memorial, a drive along Embassy Row, and a tour of the Washington National cathedral. Our next stop is at Hillwood Estate Museum and Gardens, home of the former cereal heiress Marjorie Merriweather Post, which features a collection of Russian Imperial art and French decorative arts. You will be treated to a self-guided audio tour and lunch on the grounds. After lunch, we stop at the Air Force Memorial and then meet our costumed colonial guide in Old Town Alexandria. On our way to dinner, we will be entertained by stories, legends, and folklore about colonial times. Our final tour and meal of the day will be at Gadsby's Tavern, where nearly all of the founders of American Independence enjoyed the warm tavern hospitality. The menu includes a Tavern Salad, Sally Lunn Bread, and your choice of Prime Rib, Chicken Fontina, Grilled Salmon or Seasonal Ravioli. There will also be delicious dessert choices. (Meals: B, L, D)

Day 5: Sunday, April 7, 2024

After breakfast at hotel, we will take the Spirit Cruise to Mount Vernon, the estate of George Washington. After the mansion tour, visit the Ford Orientation Center and Donald W. Reynolds Museum and Education Center, with 25 galleries displaying the life of our nation's first president. We then have time to enjoy lunch and shopping on our own in Old Town Alexandria. After lunch we tour the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. Dinner this evening will be at the Fogo de Chao Brazilian Steakhouse. On the way back to the hotel, we take an Illuminated Monument Driving Tour of many of the memorials and monuments which are stunning at night. (Meals: B, D)

Day 6: Monday, April 8, 2024

After breakfast, we check out of the hotel and head to Monticello, the mountaintop home of Thomas Jefferson. Lunch today will be at the Historic Michie Tavern, one of the oldest homesteads remaining in Virginia. We then drive to Roanoke where we check into the Hotel Roanoke, where we stayed the first night of the trip. Dinner will be provided at the hotel this evening. (Meals: B, L, D)

Day 7: Tuesday, April 9, 2024

After breakfast we check out and head home. Lunch will be at your expense along the way. (Meals: B)
